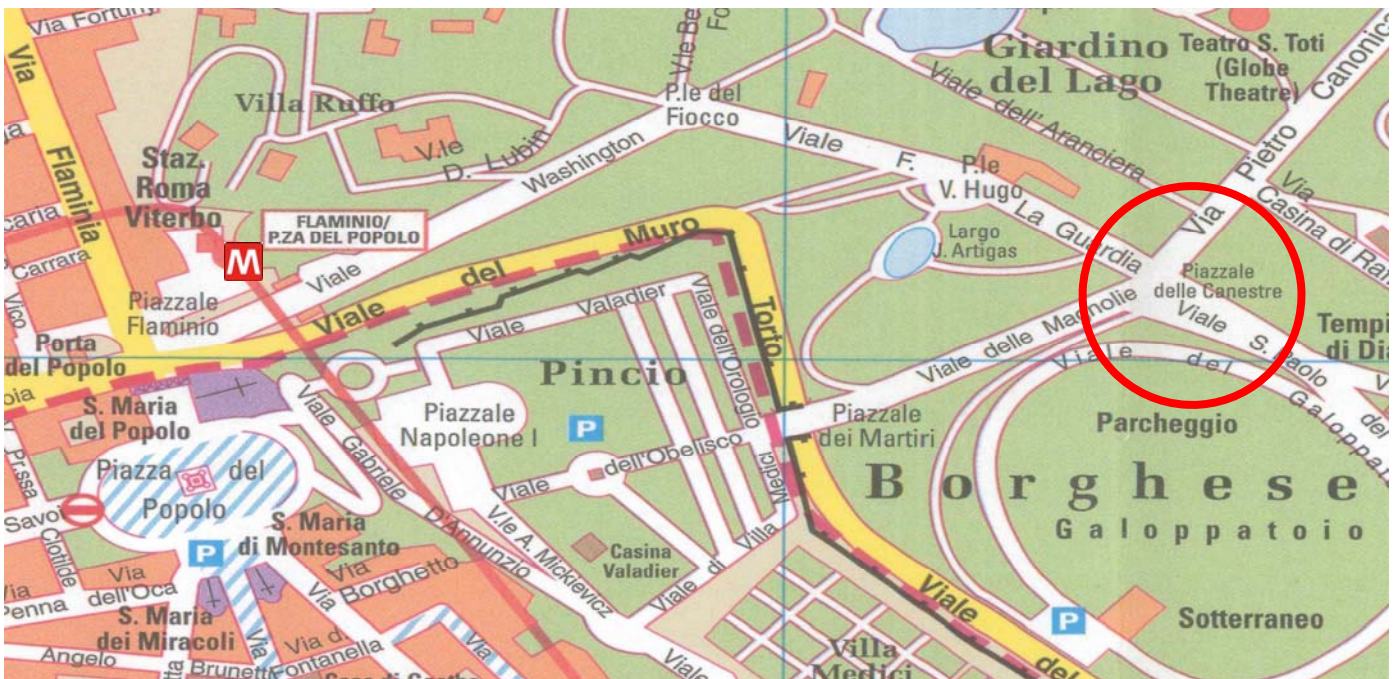

Said service will be available at **Piazzale delle Canestre (Villa Borghese)**, where public transport shuttles and private buses will leave from **15.00 p.m.**

Any problems that arise during their stay in Rome should be reported to the relevant authorities by calling **113** either from public telephone booths found throughout the city or by mobile phone.

Entry to the Stadium for **FEYENOORD** supporters will only and exclusively be for the "Distinti Nord" - "Lato Nord Monte Mario" *entrancy*

In order to prevent the foreign guests from having any inconvenience, the Central police Station of Rome gives notice of some provisions taken by the Italian Authorities concerning the access to the sports premises :

No admittance to:

- people without ticket
- people who have been prohibited to attend sports events, because of their own violent way of acting or since they have urged, praised or led to acts of violence in past similar circumstances
- people who are visibly drunk or under narcotics effect

It is forbidden:

- to carry weapons or any other blunt or harmful instrument, as well as any object which may cause damage
 - to carry smoke-producing substances or any explosive and firework material
 - to carry crash helmets
 - to carry any alcoholic drinks or drugs
 - to carry drinks contained into open cans or glass bottles
 - to hang out banners praising to violence, to racial hatred and to hostility between opposite fans groups, as well as to display material provided with the characteristic marks of political groups, so that dangerous reaction might result to climb over the fencing – both inside and outside the sports premise, as well as to jump from one zone to the other to throw objects, to alter his/her own look through helmets, scarves, ecc...
 - to swarm onto the playing field for no reason, not even for celebrations, if any, at the end of the match
 - to cause damage to the structures, even by painting or spraying
 - to cause damage to the artistic wealth of the Capital, in conform with the Ordinance n.412 dated 20 August 2002 set forth by the Mayor of Rome, wherein it is even forbidden to bath at Roman fountains.
- Under the regulation currently in force, every flag, placard, vertical or horizontal banner displayed by the fans, the contents of which shall refer exclusively to the sporting event in question, shall be pre-emptively subjected to scrutiny by the Public Safety Authority.
